Travelling to and from Bristol

Bristol is one of the most easily accessible cities in the UK, with excellent road, rail, bus and air links.

By road: Bristol is ideally situated for road access from London as well as from the north and east of England, it being situated at the intersection of the M4 and M5 motorways.

By air: Bristol has a large **international airport**, with EasyJet and BMI providing domestic flights to a number of UK airports. You can access the Flyer Airport Express bus service to get to Temple Meads railway station or Bristol Bus & Coach Station. By train: **Bristol Temple Meads railway station** is the largest rail hub in the west of England, with direct services available from London, Scotland, Wales, Manchester and Birmingham.

By bus: Bristol Bus & Coach station is centrally situated at Marlborough Street, near the Broadmead shopping area. [Click here for more information](#).

Travelling to and from the Bristol Marriott Royal Hotel

By car: Take the A38 towards Bristol City Centre then exit onto the A3029 signposted Bristol City Centre. Travel through three roundabouts. Stay in the left lane and exit onto the A4. Take the third exit from the roundabout onto Anchor Road. Turn left and the hotel will be on the left. The hotel offers on site parking; £7 hourly, £16 daily.
